B1 Grade: Awarded a **3-Star Badge**

Given to students who have shown solid performance, steady progress, and reliable understanding of concepts.

B2 Grade: Awarded a **2-Star Badge**

Acknowledges sincere effort, improvement, and the potential to reach higher levels of academic excellence.


Exciting School Picnic to Guwahati & Sonapur
